

No fuzz Scarf



This scarf is so simple that it really doesn't need a whole document, but for the sake of my own documentation it still gets one. I love scarves knitted sideways like this one, so simple to knit, yet with great effect. And this yummy yarn knits up so quickly that you can make this scarf in an evening.

Material

Yarn: Phildar Nebuleuse, 1 ball each in the following colors: Ecu, Poudre, Coral and Ebene.

Knitting needles: Circular needles 15 mm at least 80 cm long (Preferably 120 cm long).

Gauge: 8 maskor = 10 cm. (not very important.)

Size: Approximately. 2 meters x 19 centimeters.

Other stuff: Crochethook to attach the fringe with and a yarnneedle to sew in ends with.

Start

Start by cutting the pieces for the fringe. You can of course choose length and how many you like but this is how I made mine: I cut 18 pieces, 24 cm long of each color. These will make 6 "fringegroups" consisting of 3 pieces of thread each, of each color.

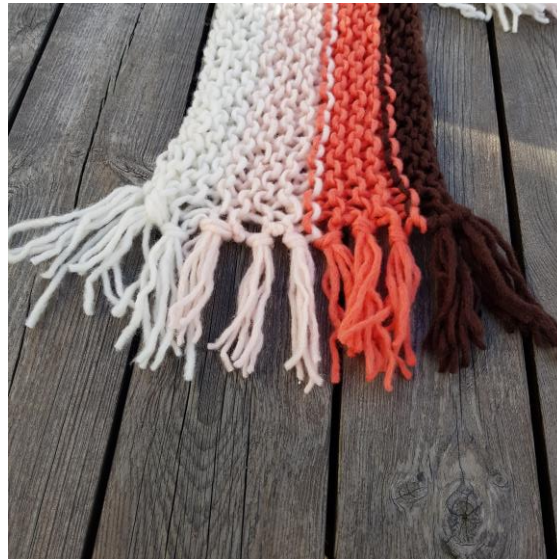
Time to knit: Cast on 120 stitches with color Ecu and knit back and forth until you run out of yarn. (It's ok if it's in the middle of a row.) Change to Poudre and knit up the whole ball, and

then do the same with Coral. When you knit with Ebene, make sure you have enough yarn for the casting off.

Finishing

Sew in all ends and attach the fringes. I placed 3 "fringegroups" on each corresponding color on each side.



Block if you like, but I didn't think it was necessary.



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
