

Rosario Scarf



I love scarves. Shawls has their charm, but I prefer a long cozy scarf anyday. The length of this scarf is easy to adjust. I used exactly 2 balls of each 3 colors (6 balls in total) for this scarf and by that I mean *exactly*, I had less than 50 cm left in each color so I would recommend you to buy 3 of each color, unless you are a bit on the adventurous side. ☺ If you want to make a two colored scarf (instead of the two pinks using just one color) you'll be fine with 5 balls of that color.

Material

Yarn: Merino sport by Katia yarns: 3 balls of pink # 28 (color 1), 3 balls of cericepink # 35 (color 2) and 3 balls of white # 3 (color 3).

Knitting needles: Straight needles 5,5 mm.

Gauge: Not important, make a swatch on needles 5,5 and se how it drapes. If you don't like it change to smaller or larger needles.

Size: 177 cm long and 23 cm wide when blocked.

Other stuff: A crochethook for attaching the tassels and a yarnneedle to sew in ends with.

Pattern "zigzag":

Pattern multiple by 18 + 1.

If the last stitch of the previous row is knit, then the first stitch of the following row should be purled.

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Row 1: Knit with color 3 (white) and purl with color 1 and 2 (pink and cerice).

Row 2: k1 if last stitch of previous row is purled, **OR** p1 if last stitch of previous row is knit., make 1 left * k7, SK2P, k7, make 1 right, **k1**, make 1 left*. Repeat *-* until you have 18 sts left on needle: k7, SK2P, k7, make 1 right, k1.

Make 1 left: Se pic and description at the end of document

Make 1 right: Se pic and description at the end of document.

SK2P: Slip 1 stitch knitwise (with yarn in back), knit 2 stitches together, pull the slipped stitch over the two stitches you knit together.

Start:

With white yarn (color 3) cast on 55 stitches on knitting needles 5,5 mm.

Repeat the 2 rows of the zigzagpattern. I changed color as following:

9 rows white (color 3)

*16 rows pink (color 1)

8 rows white (color 3)

16 rows cerice (color 2)

8 rows white (color 3)*

Repeat *-* until you're happy with the length of the scarf, I made a total of 7 repeats. On the last white part I knitted 9 rows and then cast off.


Always start a new color on a Row 2.

Fringe

Make the fringe. I cut my yarn in 30 cm long pieces (15 cm long when folded) and I made 19 groups with 3 yarnpieces in each (6 when folded). I made one side with pink and one side with cerice. (see pic.)




Make 1 left = pick up the loop between the stitches with right needle and twist to the left and put it on the left needle (see pic.) knit through back loop.




Pic shows how it looks like when you've picked up the loop between stitches and put it on the right needle. Next step is to pull away the right needle and knit the stitch through back loop.

Make 1 right = Pick up the loop between the stitches with the right needle and twist to the right and put it on the left needle (see pic), knit through front loop (like you normally do).



Picture shows what it looks like when you've just picked up the loop between stitches, with your right needle and put it on the left needle. Next step is to pull away the right needle and knit the stitch through front loop (like you normally would).

Tip: You see the "knot" I've drawn a circle around? This is what it should look like when you've make 1 right. The knot should be in the front, and you thus knit through front loop.



When you make 1 left, this "knot" is behind the work and then you knit through back loop.
