

Anoppi shawl



I love gradient yarns, but I find it tricky to decide on a suitable pattern, as I don't want a too busy pattern to take the attention from the color. This pattern is great for any yarn, as you just repeat the pattern until you're happy with the size. I've used the yarn Infinity shawl from Katia Yarns for the knits and Tencel Merino (also from Katia Yarns and you can buy them at Favoritgarner.com). These yarns are completely different but I only think it's a good thing. The shape of this shawl is a simple Crescent shawl, with a crochet twist, or actually more of a crochet pop. 😊

Material

Yarn: Color 1: 1 ball of Katia Infinity Shawl color 306. Color 2: 1 ball of Katia Tencel-Merino, color 50.

Knitting needles: Circular 5,0 mm, at least 80 cm long.

Crochet hook: 4,0 mm.

Gauge: Not important, but to get an idea, the ballband of infinity shawl says 19 sts/10 cm when using needles 4-4,5 mm.

Size: ca. 160 cm across

Other stuff: 2 stitchmarkers, yarnneedle and scissors.

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Knitting abbreviations:

k: Knit

yo: Yarn over

Crochet abbreviations (US terms):

Sc: Single crochet

5pop: Make five double crochet in same stitch. Remove hook from workingloop, insert it through both loops of first double crochet made, pick up workingloop and pull it through the loop, chain 1 to seal the pop (does not count as a stitch, so be careful when making the next round).

Picot: Chain 3, slipstitch in first chain.

Start:

Preparation:

Start with knitting and color 1 on circular needles 5,0 mm. Cast on 3 stitches on circular needles 4 mm and knit garterstitch for 8 rows (you can of course use straight needles for this too and switch to the circulars when the straights becomes to short, as long circulars can be a bit fiddly with just a few stitches on them). Turn work 90 degrees and pick up 4 stitches along the longside of work, and 3 on the other shortside = 10 stitches on needles. Knit following startingrows:

Startingrow: k3, place marker, k4, place marker, k3.

Increases:

Row 1 (right side): k3, slip marker, (k1, yo, k1) in 1 stitch, knit until 1 stitch remains before marker, (k1, yo, k1) in same stitch, slip marker, k3 (=4 stitches are increased)

Row 2 (wrong side): k3, slip marker, yo, knit until second marker, yo, slip marker, k3. (=2 stitches are increased)

Repeat these 2 rows until you've knit a total of 18 rows. End with a row 2 and cast off loosly. Cut yarn and sew in ends (or you can be like me and sew them in at the end, regretting not having it done as I went).

****Time for crochet hook and color 2: Tencel-merino.

With right side facing you: 2 sc, * 5 pop, 1 sc*. Repeat *-* until end of row, end with 2 sc.

Don't crochet too tightly! It's ok to adjust the stitches if it doesn't even out with 2 sc at the end of the row. Cut yarn and sew in ends. (Or save that for later and regret you didn't do it along the way.)

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Time for knitting and color 1 again. With right side facing you, pick up one stitch in every back loop of each crochetstitch. Remember that the popcorns look like 2 stitches, but you should only pick up one: one for each popcorn and one for each sc.

Start with a row 2 (since wrong side is facing you) and knit a total of 19 rows (when wrong side is facing you, knit a row 1 and when right side is facing you knit a row 2), and cast off on a rightside row. Cut yarn and sew in ends. ****

Repeat ****-**** until you're happy with the size. I made a total of 6 repeats. (6 rows of popcorn). End with a popcorn row and then it's time for a crochetborder with color 1.

Border

The border is made of a crochet edge with color 1, and crochethook 4.0 mm. Remember (again) that it looks like each popcorn is made of two stitches, but counts as one stitch.

Row 1:

With right side facing, 2 sc (start with a standing sc or a slipstitch and chain 1) *skip popcorn, 7 dc in next sc, skip popcorn, 3 sc (these stitches are made in sc, popcorn, sc)* Repeat *-* until 2 stitches remains and end with 2 sc. Your stitches might not ad up evenly but it's ok to skip an extra stitch or make two in the same. Cut yarn (and sew in ends).

Row 2:

With right side facing, 1 sc in first sc, skip 1 sc, * 1 dc, (2 dc in same stitch) twice, (1 dc, picot, 1 dc) in same stitch, which should be the middle dc, (2 dc in same stitch) twice, 1 dc, skip 1 sc, 1 sc, skip 1 sc*. Repeat *-* until end of row, 1 sc in last sc.

Cut yarn, sew in all ends and block the shawl.





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
